Tonight, for the first time, we will recognise businesses small and large from across the world that are leading the way in reducing their impact on climate change, by cutting their greenhouse gas emissions.



Tom Delay was appointed as the first Chief Executive of the Carbon Trust in 2001.

A chartered engineer with extensive experience of the energy sector, Tom worked for Shell for 16 years in a variety of commercial and operations roles including four years as General Manager of Pizo Shell – a Shell subsidiary in Gabon, Africa. He moved into management consultancy with McKinsey and Co and then as a Principal with the Global Energy Practice of AT Kearney before joining the Carbon Trust. Tom gained a first class honours degree in mechanical engineering from the University of Southampton in 1981 and completed an MBA at INSEAD, Paris in 1988.

Fiona Harvey is the environment correspondent of the FT, appointed in 2004. Previously, she was a technology writer, having joined the organisation as an IT and telecoms reporter for FT.com in 2000. Fiona has been a journalist since 1994. Before joining the FT, she was editor of PC Week, and was responsible for the launch of Internet World magazine in the UK. She has also written on a freelance basis for Scientific American, the New Scientist and the Encyclopaedia Britannica. In 2005, she won the Foreign Press Association environment story of the year award for an FT Magazine article on climate change sceptics. Fiona holds a degree in English Literature from Cambridge University.

In her capacity at Morgan Stanley she ran three businesses for the Firm - Ultra-high Net Worth, Morgan Stanley Iberia and Morgan Stanley Quilter. She was a member of Morgan Stanley's European Executive Committee, a director of Morgan Stanley International Limited, a director of Morgan Stanley Quilter and chairman of Morgan Stanley Iberia. She was a board member of both Morgan Stanley's UK and Swiss Banks. In addition she was a member of the European Diversity Council. Marianne joined PWM in 1999 as Chief Investment Officer from Private Equity where she was President of the Global Emerging Markets Private Equity Fund. She joined Morgan Stanley in New York in 1993 in the institutional investment management business where she became co-head of Global Emerging Markets in 1995.

Marianne began her early career in Edinburgh where she was an analyst with the Bank of Scotland followed by Portfolio Manager with Ivory & Sime and then became a director of Martin Currie.

Marianne graduated from Edinburgh University with an Honours Degree in Biochemical Genetics and holds a Diploma in Education. She also completed the qualification of the Institute of Bankers in Scotland.

Rachel Kyte

Rachel Kyte, a British national, became Director of the Environment and Social Development Department at the International Finance Corporation (IFC) in January 2004. She is responsible for assuring quality and innovating new business based on sustainability. Since joining the department she has stewarded the development and adoption of the new sustainability policy, performance standards and disclosure policy for IFC and overseen an overhaul in internal systems and procedures to support the strategic importance IFC places on environmental and social sustainability. IFC's policies form the basis for the Equator Principles.

Prior to this appointment, she was Principal Specialist in the Office of the Compliance Advisor/Ombudsman of IFC/MIGA. Before joining IFC, Rachel held a number of senior positions with IUCN - The World Conservation Union. A graduate of the University of London and the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, she has worked extensively within the environment, women's and health movements as a policy analyst and advocate.



Robert Napier

Robert Napier has been Chairman of the Board of the Met Office since October 2006. He retired as Chief Executive of the international conservation group WWF-UK in April 2007 after eight years in that post. Prior to WWF, Robert had a commercial career and was Chief Executive of Redland PLC from 1991 to 1997. He has served as a non-executive director of Rentokil Initial PLC and of United Biscuits PLC and as President of the Council of Building Materials and as Chairman of the CBI Transport Policy Committee.

Robert is currently a non-executive director of Anglian Water and of English Partnerships. He is a Trustee of the Carbon Disclosure Project; of WCMC 2000; of the South Georgia Heritage Trust; of the Baynards Zambia Trust and of the Watts Gallery. He is Chairman of the Green Fiscal Commission and of the Governors of Sedbergh School.



Robert Repetto

Professor in the Practice of Economics and Sustainable Development
Yale School of Forestry and Environmental Studies

Robert Repetto's area of expertise is environmental and resource economics. From 1998 to 2000, he held a Pew Fellowship in Marine Conservation at the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution. Until 1998 he was vice president and senior economist at the World Resources Institute in Washington, DC where he authored numerous books and monographs on environmental policy. He has served on EPA's Science Advisory Board and National Advisory Council on Environmental Policy and Technology, on the National Research Council's Board on Sustainable Development and on many NRC committees. Robert has been a professor at the Harvard School of Public Health; a World Bank official working in Indonesia; an economic advisor in Bangladesh; a Ford Foundation staff economist in India and an economic analyst in the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. His work has been honored by the Society for Conservation Biology and the British Medical Association. His recent work on environment and finance was awarded the Moskowitz Prize for 2000.

John Ridding has been Chief Executive of the Financial Times newspaper and FT.com since June 2006. He was formerly Editor and Publisher of the Financial Times, Asia, as well as Chairman of Pearson in Asia.

John led the launch of the Asia edition of the FT in 2003. It won the award for the best newspaper from the Society of Publishers in Asia in its launch year and picked up top awards for business reporting, scoops and newspaper design at the same ceremony in 2006. He also led the development of the FT's Chinese language website.

John has also served as Deputy Editor; Hong Kong bureau chief; Paris correspondent; Korea correspondent, UK companies reporter and foreign desk correspondent.

Between 1986 and 1987, he worked at Oxford Analytica on the Asia Pacific desk. He graduated from Oxford University with a first class honours degree in philosophy, politics and economics.

Trucost has undertaken research projects on behalf of the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs, the Environment Agency, the Carbon Disclosure Project and many leading financial institutions worldwide.

Prior to founding Trucost, Simon co-founded the emerging markets investment trust business at LCF Edmond de Rothschild and launched the first fund to invest in emerging North African equities. Simon has also held senior positions at Nomura International and Swiss Banking Corporation. From 1981-1987 he worked for Reed International, ultimately as a magazine publisher within their Business Press division.

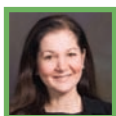

Robert Watson is currently Chair of Environmental Sciences at the University of East Anglia; Director for Strategic Development for the Tyndall Center and Chief Scientific Advisor to the UK Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs. Previous positions include Associate Director for the Environment in the White House and Chief Scientist at the World Bank. Robert has also chaired, co-chaired and directed international scientific, technical and economic assessments of stratospheric ozone depletion, biodiversity/ecosystems (the GBA and MA), climate change (IPCC) and agricultural S&T (IAASTD). His areas of expertise include managing and coordinating national and international environmental programs, research programs and assessments; advising on the policy implications of scientific information and policy options for action and communicating scientific, technical and economic information to policymakers. Robert has received numerous national and international awards, including in 2003 – Honorary “Companion of the Order of Saint Michael and Saint George” from the United Kingdom.
